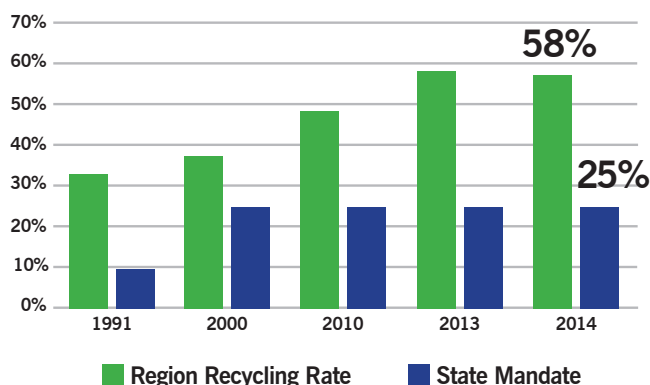

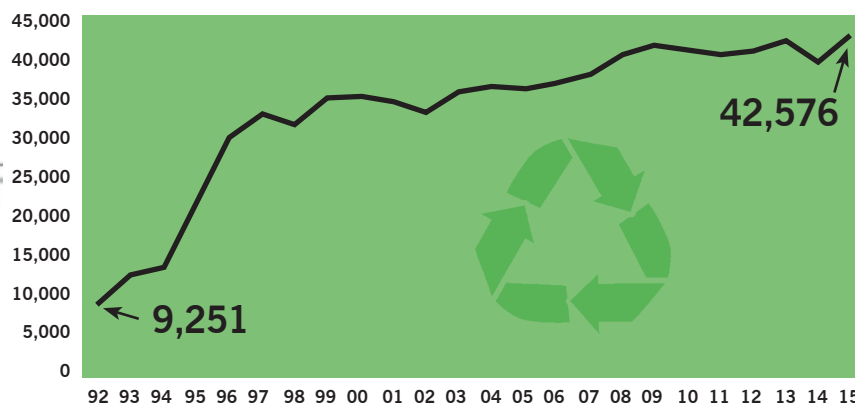


### Annual Regional Recycling Rate
